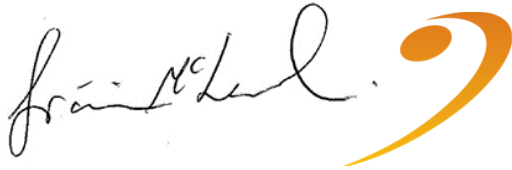
A message from the Head of School

KEVIN SADLER SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

At the Gateway Academy we have introduced a new Award. The Kevin Sadler Scholarship Award is nominated by our teaching body and this year we had two winners:

Well done to the wonderful Lilie De Breuk who received the prestigious Kevin Sadler Scholarship award. The scholarship is £1,000 every year for three years to support the award winner in the next stage of their educational journey. Lilie studied at the Gateway Academy and achieved outstanding GCSE results before going on to study history, Spanish and art history A-Levels, achieving A* in Spanish, A* in art history and an A in history. She did an EPQ alongside this focusing on imperial Japanese architecture and its impact upon the Korean people and achieved an A in this also. Lilie is going to the University of Sheffield to study BA Japanese Studies where she will mainly focus on the language with modules in culture, history, economy and society.



Well done to the fantastic Abiaz Afzal who has also received the prestigious Kevin Sadler Scholarship award. Abiaz studied at the Gateway Academy and achieved GCSE grade 9s in all of his subjects. He then studied A levels in Maths, Further Maths, Chemistry and Biology, achieving 4 A*s, as well as an A* in the Extended Project Qualification. Abiaz is now moving into his second year studying medicine at the University of Cambridge.

Your child will receive these electronically via Google Classroom for each subject. Here is a guide on how you can encourage your child to use Knowledge Organisers to learn at home. Education theory shows that when parents/carers engage in supporting their child's learning at home,

- Pick a subject to recall and memorise
- Look at the pages for that subject
- Read the page information for that subject
- Cover the page of information
- Write the information for that subject from memory
- Check what you have written. Correct mistakes and add anything you have missed
- Your teacher will quiz you in class to see what you can recall
- Repeat the process over time and focus on the information you keep missing or make mistakes on

You'll find really useful information about colleges and sixth forms spanning the country, with great advice regarding courses, the difference in qualifications, distance, travel and bursaries. You can even search for live apprenticeships and make a short list to help you stay in control of your own destination.

The life of QUEEN ELIZABETH II

1926

Princess Elizabeth is born in London.

1945

Towards the end of World War II, 18-year-old Elizabeth joins the Auxiliary Territorial Service and trains as a driver and a mechanic.

1947

Princess Elizabeth marries Prince Philip, an officer in the Royal Navy.

1948

The princess gives birth to her first child, a boy named Charles who will grow up to be King.

1953

The new Queen is crowned at Westminster Abbey – the first coronation to be televised. Sales of TVs so many families buy one for the first time to watch the ceremony. The eventual worldwide audience is around 277 million.

1957

Her Majesty gives the first televised Christmas broadcast to the nation. 'The Queen's Speech' goes on to become a permanent and powerful tradition of the festive season.

1966

Her Majesty is at Wembley to see England beat West Germany (as it was called before the Berlin Wall came down) 4-2 in the World Cup final, presenting the trophy to victorious captain Bobby Moore.

1977

Britain and the Commonwealth celebrate the Queen's silver jubilee (marking 25 years on the throne). A chain of beacons is lit around the country, and thousands of street parties are held.

2015

Having ruled for 63 years, Queen Elizabeth becomes the longest-reigning monarch in British history – overtaking her great great grandmother, Queen Victoria.

2022

The nation celebrates the Queen's Platinum Jubilee with more events and street parties. Sadly, however, Her Majesty's health declines and she passes away months later, aged 96. After 70 years of rule, Queen Elizabeth II leaves a legacy of lasting affection and respect from people not only in the UK, but around the whole world.

Did you know?...

The Queen received her first Corgi, Susan, as an 18th birthday present. She loved that breed of dog throughout her life, going on to own another 30 of them.

As Britain was still recovering from the effects of the war, the young Princess Elizabeth had to save ration coupons to buy the material for her wedding dress!

The Queen took the unusual step of inviting a TV documentary crew into Buckingham Palace in 1959. This let people see the Royal Family in a way they'd never been able to before.

In 1982, a mentally ill man broke into the palace and reached the Queen's bedroom! Reports suggest Her Majesty calmly kept him talking for 10 minutes until the security team arrived.

It was Queen Elizabeth who, in 1993, decided to open up Buckingham Palace to visitors from the public for the first time.

To help launch the 2012 Olympics in London, Her Majesty featured in a short film where she meets super-spy James Bond, as played by Daniel Craig.

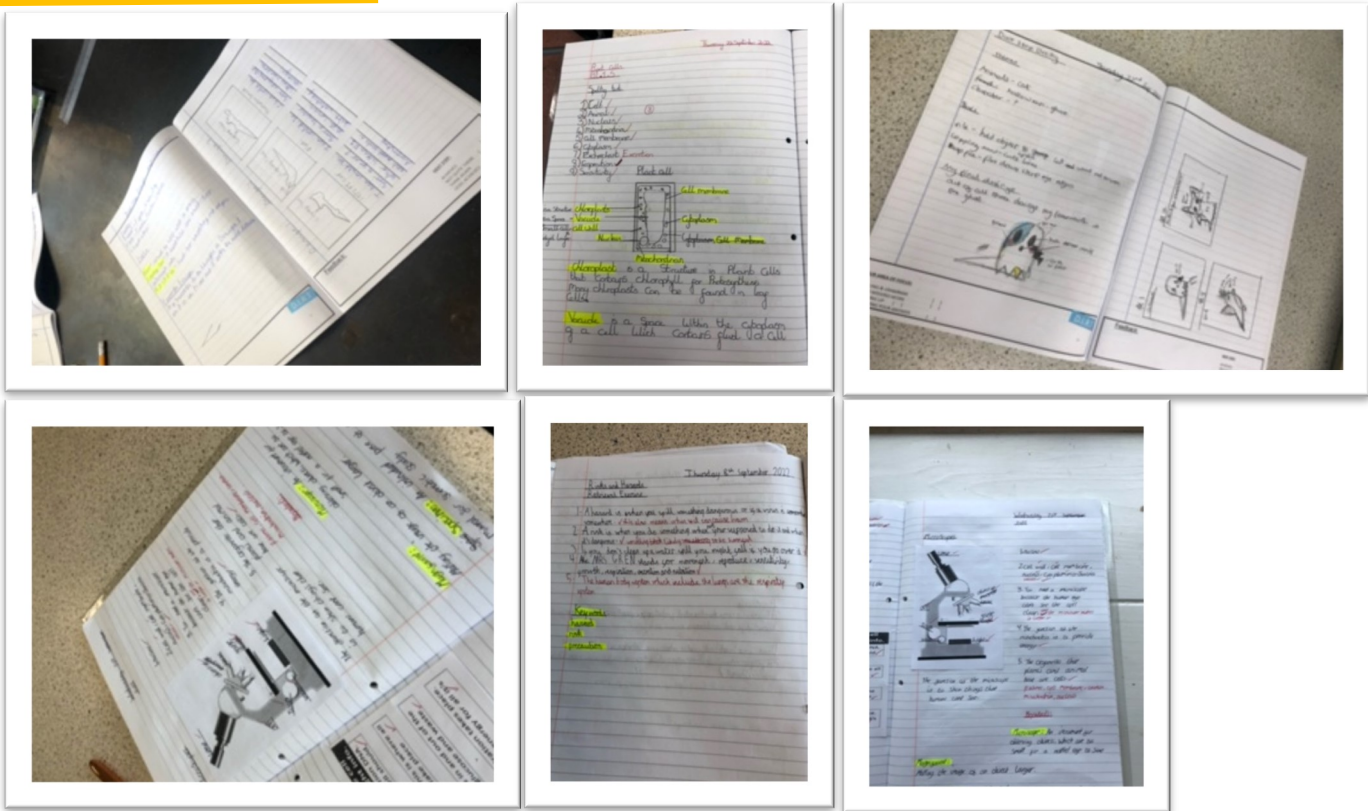

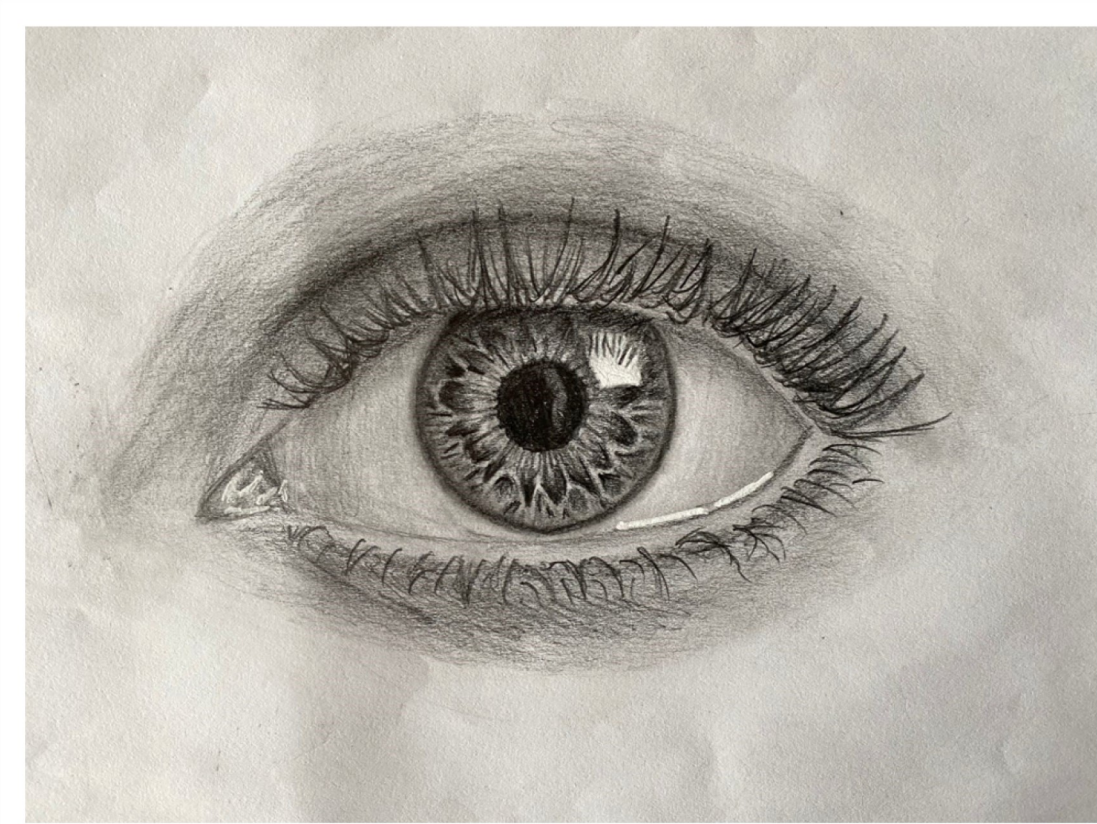
Sandy Summer Street. By Abaan.

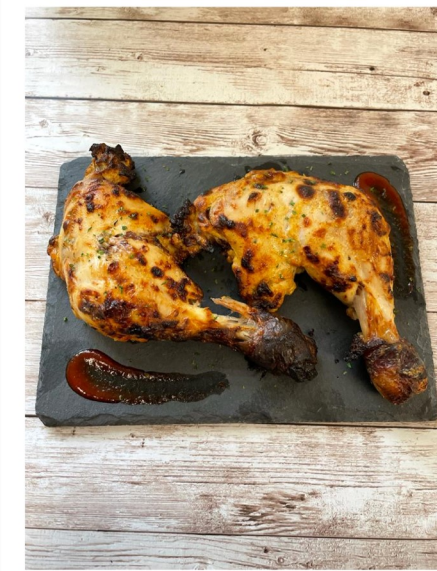

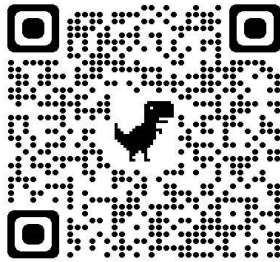
TECHNOLOGY NEWS

BRILLIANT TUTORING PROGRAMME

Part of the National Tutoring Programme, the Brilliant Tutoring Programme is specifically designed to support, stretch and challenge identified More Able students through small group tuition in core subjects: Maths, English, Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

The programme was launched at the Gateway Academy in the summer term 2022 (from May 16th to July 13th 2022) with 42 Year 10 students. Targeted students received specialist, intensive 15 hours of tutoring in small groups delivered by the Brilliant Club subject expert University tutors. The 2 hours per week tutorials focused specifically on three modules in English and Biology, aimed at accelerating the academic progress of these students in these

these subjects: 24 participated in the KS4 English tutorials and 18 in Biology tutorials.

Following the success of this programme in the summer term, the Year 11 students will continue with the programme this Autumn term. Additionally, the Gateway Academy has decided to extend the intake to Year 10 high achieving students: 32 of them have been identified and will take part in Cohort 2 of the programme in October 2022.

Autumn 2022 subject focus:

- KS4 English
- KS4 Physics and
- KS4 Chemistry

All 72 Year 11 and 10 students taking part in the programme this Autumn term have been selected based on their KS2 prior attainment data and their Summer term 2022 predicted grades in English, Chemistry and Physics. They will receive 15 hours free tuition in in one of these subjects this Autumn term. The Brilliant Club exists to increase the number of underrepresented students progressing to competitive universities.

Roblox is one of the most popular video games on the market. By 2020, the game's makers were claiming that more than half of children in the USA play it.
