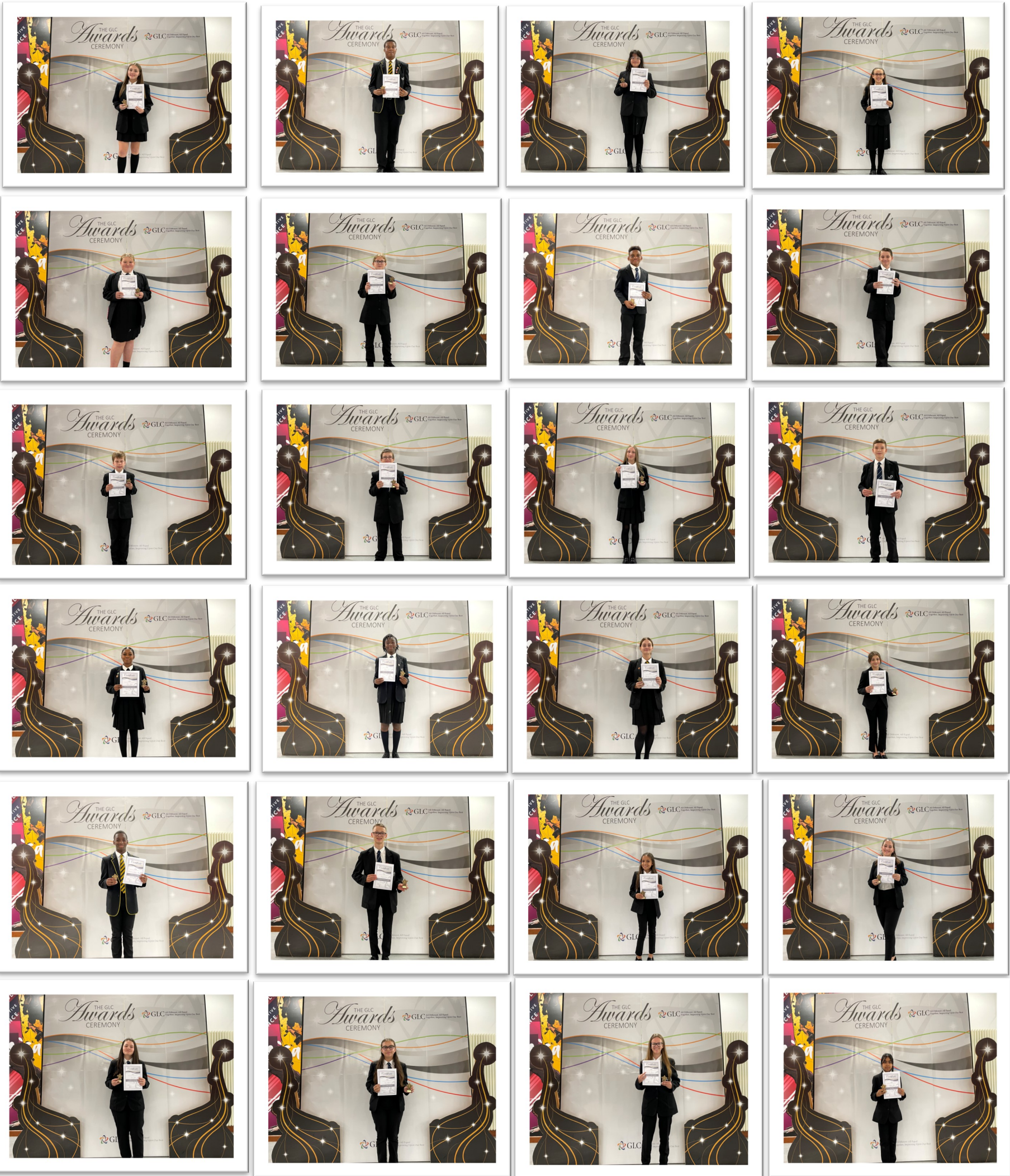

YEAR 9 Mrs A Shannon

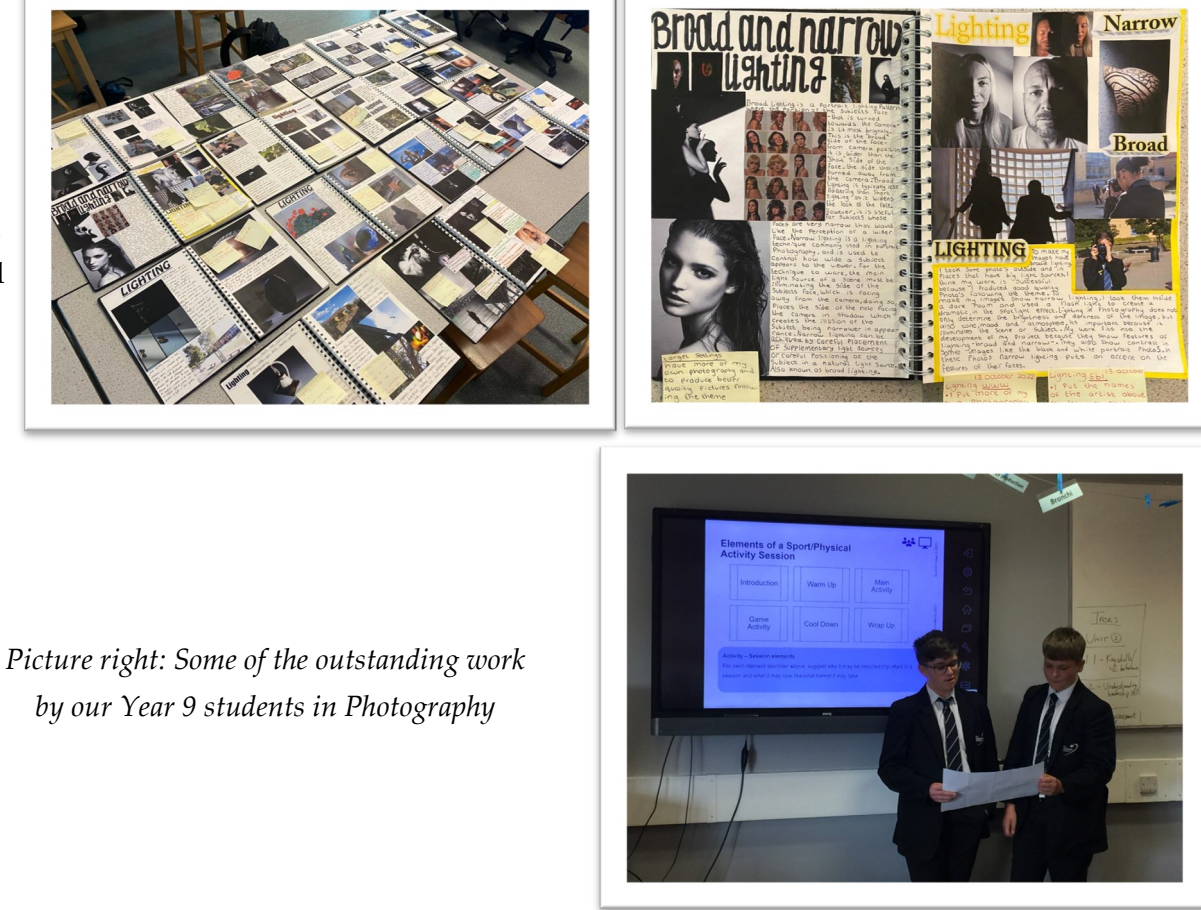

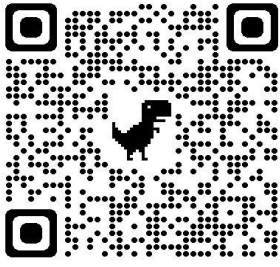
